However we were all absolutely delighted when she announced the winners of the Angus Youth Trophy as Carnoustie Theatre Club Youth. This means that they will go forward to represent Angus at the Divisional Youth Final to be held in the Webster Theatre on Saturday 13th March 2004. (Performances start at 5.00pm and tickets will be available at the door.) Here, they will compete with three other youth teams to win the Morton Trophy and a place in the Scottish Youth Finals! So please be there on Saturday 13th to support our very successful Youth Team.

The next prize to be awarded was the Sheills Trophy for stage presentation. This went to Kaims Players for their wonderful set depicting a hospital side ward, consultants office, nurses station and corridor! Second place in the Festival, a place in the Divisional Finals and the Kay Fleming Cup went to Forfar Dramatic Society for their ambitious performance of "Blue Remembered Hills". However, the real surprise of the evening came when the winner of first place in the Festival, a place in the Divisional Finals and the Ian MacKay Trophy was announced as Carnoustie Theatre Club Youth! It was a truly magical moment and one that I am sure Laura, her cast and team will never forget!

Our Youth Team and Forfar DS will go forward to represent Angus in the Divisional finals which take place in Aberdeen Arts Centre at the end of this month (25th - 27th March 2004). Diary of a Panto

This is the first in what I hope will be a regular article for Sightline on the putting together of the panto for this December. I intend it to be a “warts and all” diary column showing how the panto is produced from scratch and I will share the good and not so good with you as we go along. So sit back and relax – December is not that far away!!

Sunday 11th January – well that’s the first bit done. After thinking about all this over Christmas, I have finally decided to put an application in to the Committee to produce the panto for 2004 – I must be mad! I said after the last time I did this, that it would be my first and last time. It was such an emotionally draining experience that I thought I would never recover – but that didn’t last long. Soon all the good bits were remembered and the scars began to heal – despite the traumas, it was a great experience for me, so here goes again! Of course, some other mad fool might apply also and I won’t be accepted!

Tuesday 13th January – the Committee have accepted my application, so there is no going back now! What a mixture of feelings – delighted (I think!) that the Committee are confident I can do it, excited to be given the chance and scared stiff at the enormity of the task ahead! But I know that the Club has a well-oiled machine for putting all the bits together – we have been producing pantos for over 20 years, and always get rave reviews, so we must be quite good at it!

Grant Wilson will be my Assistant Producer (his first time at this), Lyn Ross (yes – her indoors!) will again be Panto Manager and Donald Cheape the Stage Manager – so that’s a fair bit of experience already. Now to find a Musical Director, a Choreography Co-ordinator and a Wardrobe Manager, plus lots of others!! We need to get the Team up and running as soon as possible – there’s so much to do!

I’ve selected four panto scripts to read (I’ll talk about the criteria for choice in the next instalment, but at this stage it’s about getting a “feel” for the right one) – give Grant two of them and we’ll swap at the weekend.
