## Help Wanted

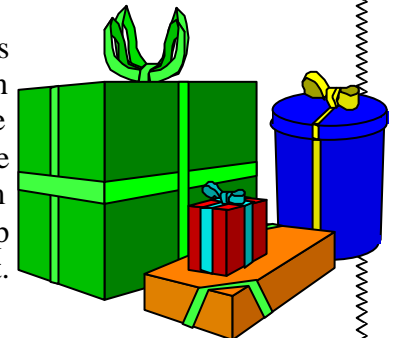

## Something to Think About!

The SCDA District One Act Play Festival takes place in the Webster Theatre in Arbroath from 26th - 28th February 2004. This year the club intends to enter three plays and although audition dates have not been set for these yet, here are a few details about each play:-

“Lovers, Winners.” by Brian Friel will be produced by Aileen Air. This play will require one female teenager aged approximately 15 - 17 years and one male teenager of the same age. Two adult narrators, one male and one female will also be required.

“Lovers, Losers.” also by Brian Friel will be produced by Grant Wilson. This play requires a middle aged ( approx 30 - 50 years ) female and a middle aged male of the same age. Also required will be two females to play a “ couple of old biddys”. As both these plays take place in Southern Ireland, accents will be required.

“The Pantomime Play” our youth entry will be produced by Laura Shepherd. This play gives lots of opportunities for all ages from primary up through all of secondary.

Details of auditions etc will be publicised in due course through the Dibble Tree notice board and our website (www.dibbletree.com user name - dibble, password - drama) and the next edition of “Sightline”. However, auditions for “The Pantomime Play” are not scheduled to be held until after the “Panto”.
