The Northern Division Youth Festival was held in The Aberdeen Arts Centre on Saturday, 16th April 2002. Our youth team were up against stiff opposition with teams from as far away as Orkney and Shetland! Everyone who went to support the teams were treated to an excellent days' entertainment. However, Carnoustie Youth performed brilliantly and were therefore awarded first prize, the “Morton Trophy” and a place in The Scottish Youth Final. This will be held in The Churchill theatre in Edinburgh on Saturday, 29th June 2002. And, as if this were not enough, they returned from the Northern Division Final in Orkney with not only the Alex Drummond Trophy for 1st place but also The Grampian Trophy for stage presentation and The Jane Nicoll Trophy for best youth presentation at District Level! A truly inspiring achievement. A huge vote of thanks must go to everyone involved, on and off-stage, in creating this truly spectacular theatrical experience. The next step in the “grand tour” is Pitlochry Festival Theatre and a much coveted place in the Scottish Finals. We all wish them continued success.

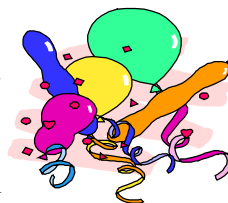


CHEESE, WINE & ONE ACT PLAY EVENINGS
