It was an extremely close contest, for as the adjudicator explained there was only one point between first and second place! With such a close result it is perhaps just as well both teams go through to the Scottish Finals. These take place in Greenock Arts Centre on 26th - 28th April 2007. Carnoustie will be performing on the Friday evening.

Other trophy winners at the Divisional finals included in third place, Stromness Drama Club, winners of The Stonehaven Salver, the Jane Nicol Youth Trophy and the Alan Nicol Trophy (for a memorable moment of theatre) for "Bouncers". The Kennedy Thomson Quaich for stage presentation and the Jenny Hill Youth Trophy went to Carnoustie Theatre Club (youth) for "We'll be Home Tomorrow". So altogether a very successful Festival for Carnoustie!

However, the good news doesn't end there! The Divisional Youth Festival which took place at Blairgowrie Town Hall earlier in the month, provided an excellent days entertainment. The audience were treated to a diverse selection of plays, performed by some very talented youth. The winner of The Morton Trophy and a place in the Scottish Youth Final to be held on 23rd June at Plockton High School was Carnoustie Theatre Club with "We'll be home Tomorrow". So plans are already well underway to send our youth to Plockton, no small undertaking both logistically and financially! With this, we will be looking for your help and support. 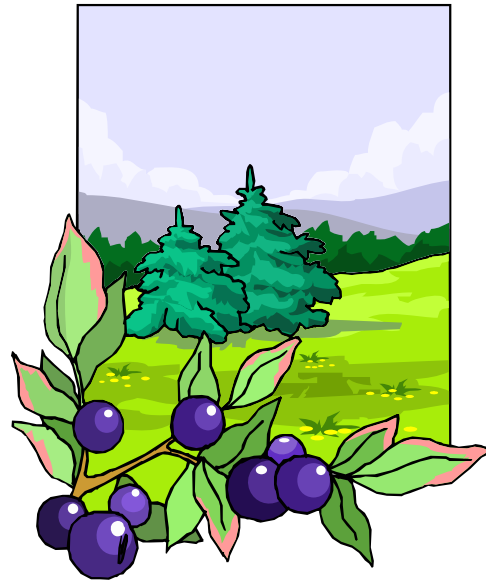


YELLOW ON THE BROOM

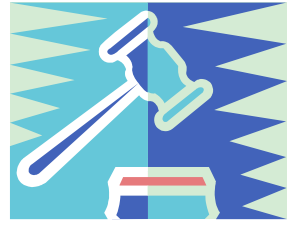
